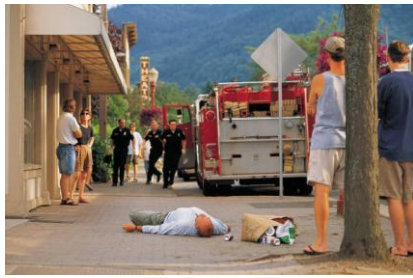


DO YOU KNOW WHAT TO DO?



In the event of a major disaster or a more common emergency, learn how to care for yourself and your family until help arrives in the:

City of Aliso Viejo Community Emergency Preparedness Academy (CEPA) Tuesday Evenings, 6:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. March 6 – April 24, 2012 At Aliso Viejo City Hall, 12 Journey

CEPA provides residents with information and skills to help themselves when emergency responders can't respond or until help can arrive. This year's program also incorporates the **Citizen's Leadership Academy**, presenting an overview of the City's municipal operations and services. The course is open to all adult residents, or teenagers attending with a parent, who are able to attend the full 8 week program. Class size is limited!

The course is **free** and participants will learn:

- **Family Disaster Plans and Earthquake Preparedness**
- **Fire Safety and Fire Extinguishers**
- **Natural Gas Service and Safety and Water Supplies**
- **Light Search and Rescue**
- **First Aid, CPR and Defibrillators (Saturday Class, April 14th, 9-4)**
- **City Government, Departments and Functions**
- **And more!**
