

There's a new crime prevention specialist in town who is working to keep Aliso Viejo - one of the county's safest cities - safe.

Julia Diane Smith recently set up shop in Aliso Viejo Police Services inside City Hall. She fills the position that was last held by longtime crime prevention specialist Margo Beauchamp, who retired in February.

Crime prevention specialists work close with the public to deter and reduce crime through active community efforts and programs like Neighborhood and Business Watch.

Julia comes to Aliso Viejo with a wealth of experience and passion.

"I come from a law enforcement family, which sparked my interest in applying with the Orange County Sheriff's Department," she said.

Julia received her liberal arts degree in social and behavioral sciences from Santiago Canyon College before transferring to Ohio State University with a bachelor's degree in criminology. She gained experience working with the Irvine Police Department before landing the opportunity to be a part of Aliso Viejo Police Services.

"I plan on getting to know the City really well and establishing a strong relationship with the residents in the progression of crime prevention," Julia said.

Lt. John MacPherson, Chief of Police Services, said Julia is a great fit for the City.

"Julia is enthusiastic about her new role, and her education combined with a friendly personality will help to us to continue our positive and open relationship with the community," he said.

Your Property Tax Dollar Breakdown

Did you know that property tax is the City's largest source of revenue? Property taxes assessed by the County of Orange are based on the valuation calculated by the County Assessor's office. For each property, the basic levy rate of 1% is divided among several governmental agencies. For every dollar paid by residential and commercial property owners, the City receives 2.13¢. Special assessments, like Mello-Roos taxes, are on top of the basic levy as noted on your property tax bill.

Low-cost Pet & Vet Clinic Aug. 2

The City's Family Resource Center and Mission Viejo Animal Services Center are teaming up again to host a low-cost Pet and Vet Clinic on Saturday, August 2 at the Iglesia Park Community Center.

The cash-only clinic will offer vaccinations and micro-chipping at discounted rates along with dog licensing from 9:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. Vaccines for cats and dogs will range from \$7 to \$28. Dogs must be on leashes and cats in carriers. The Iglesia Park Community Center is located at 24671 Via Iglesia, near Moulton Parkway and Calle Cortez.

Follow Street Sweeping Schedules

Street sweeping has been an important street maintenance activity in Aliso Viejo since the City incorporated in 2001. It keeps Aliso Viejo streets clean and attractive by removing debris such as trash, leaves and sediment from roadsides and gutters. More importantly, street sweeping is the first line of defense for preventing that debris from entering the storm drains and ultimately the ocean. Keeping the storm drains clear helps to reduce water pollution and the likelihood of flooding during heavy rain.

Street sweeping in residential areas is scheduled during the first and third weeks of each month. Please take note of the posted street sweeping days and times specific for your area and do not park in the designated areas during the scheduled activity. Parking restrictions will be enforced.
